A Message for the Second Sunday of Easter (John 20:19-31)

All of us have probably, at some point in our lives, been in a situation where we have been afraid. At this present time with the coronavirus, millions of men, women and children are afraid throughout the world and many families are worried and afraid for loved ones who are working long hours in our hospitals and care homes and supplying essential needs to us all.

In the holy Gospel for this Sunday we find that the disciples are afraid and have locked themselves away in a room. When the risen Lord appears to them in the locked room his first words to the disciples are, "Peace be with you." This is something for us all to take to heart. Jesus is speaking the same words of peace to us. This peace is not some peace of human origin, but comes from the Prince of Peace. With the peace of Jesus gifted to us, we can be people at peace with ourselves, at peace with the Lord himself; and then become people of peace for our world. It is easy to imagine Thomas' disbelief when the disciples tell him their incredible story. So, Jesus again comes among the disciples one week later, and this time they are all present, Thomas included. Again, the greeting to the disciples is the same, "Peace be with you". In the meeting between Jesus and Thomas and the discussion that follows Thomas is able to let go of his fears and makes the greatest act of faith in the risen Lord that we find in the Gospels: "My Lord and my God!" Today, may each of us bring our fears to the risen Jesus and with Thomas put our faith and trust in the Lord of life who brings each us the same greeting: "Peace be with you."
